HSC Trial Examination Instructions

The following instructions must be followed to ensure that each student is given the opportunity to give his/her best performance.

- Students **will not** be permitted to leave the examination in the first hour of any paper.
- School Attendance is required only for examinations.
- School uniform must be worn to all examinations.
- You must assemble quietly outside the examination room at least 10 minutes prior to the examination.
- You are not to enter the examination room until instructed.
- Once you have entered the examination room there is to be no communication.
- Valuables should be left at home.
- No access to bags is permitted during the examination.
- Mobile phones and listening devices should be switched off and in bags and left to one side of the hall.
- No unauthorised written material should be brought into the examination room.
- No eating or drinking other than water in a clear plastic bottle is permitted in the examination room. Except where special provisions have been allowed.
- An attendance slip must be completed in the examination room.
- Any form of misconduct will be referred to the Deputy Principal and your paper may be awarded a zero mark.

Equipment

You should write in black pen. Make sure you bring spare pens to each examination. You may also bring a ruler, highlighters, pencils and a sharpener and a bottle of water in a clear bottle. You can wear your watch to your examinations, but once you sit down you will have to take it off and place it in clear view on your desk. Programmable watches, including smart watches, will not be allowed in the examination room.

What you *cannot* bring into your examination room

- A mobile phone. Mobile phones are not permitted in an examination room under any circumstances.
- A programmable watch, eg a smart watch, Apple watch, FitBit.
- Any electronic device (except a calculator where permitted). This includes mobile phones or other communication devices, organisers, tablets (eg iPads, etc), music players or electronic dictionaries.
- Paper or any printed or written material (including your examination timetable).
- Dictionaries, except where permitted in language examinations.
- Correction fluid.

Illness & Misadventure Procedure

If you cannot attend an examination the Head Teacher of the course must be informed as soon as possible. Only medical or family emergencies are considered acceptable reasons. An Illness/Misadventure Form must be completed and a Doctor's Certificate is required for any medical reasons. Failure to provide adequate evidence of an acceptable reason, or an invalid reason, will result in a mark of zero recorded for the examination.
